12:00 – 12:45 Batch Cataloging: Improving Access to Your Collection

Roman S. Panchyshyn, Catalog Librarian, Assistant Professor, Kent State University

Responsibility for batchloading sets of MARC records into the local catalog at Kent State (KentLINK) has shifted over the last several years from systems staff to technical services staff. The primary causes of this shift have been the increasing number of electronic resources purchased locally with available MARC records packages, as well as the need for redeployment of systems staff for other projects. At Kent State University Libraries, we have tried to organize and develop effective workflows to handle these projects in technical services. Technical services staff have had to learn new skills, such as batch processing software and scripting language, in order to manipulate large groups of records in batch. We also developed a checklist process which provides the Library with a consistent framework for managing individual batch cataloging projects. Both the skill sets and the checklist process will be addressed in the presentation.
